The research seminar and workshop is organized by Childbearing – the qualitative research network (BfiN), Network for Women's Health in Childbearing, with the focus on Migrants and Minorities, (WoMBH-net) and Centre for Women's, Family and Child Health, University of South-Eastern Norway (USN).

The aim of the research seminar and workshop is to **enable a deeper understanding of various qualitative approaches and methods used in childbearing research.** Qualitative research is an important tool for developing optimal care in childbearing from parents' and professionals' perspectives, and during the seminar, we will focus on traditional as well as evolving research methods in presentations and workshops.

Participants will have the possibility to present her/ his qualitative research project in the areas of childbearing, from pregnancy, birth, postpartum and neonatal care, focusing on approaches and methods used in the studies. The seminar will provide the opportunity to exchange experiences and elaborate on present and future collaborative international research in qualitative research methods.



The University of South-Eastern Norway, campus Vestfold is located between Horten and Tønsberg Tønsberg - Wikipedia. Tønsberg has appr 55 000 inhabitants and is one of the oldest towns in Norway, founded by the Vikings in the 9th century.

The town is home of <u>Oseberg Mound</u>, where the 9th-century Oseberg ship was excavated. It is also home to <u>Tønsberg Fortress</u> on Castle Mountain (Slottsfjellet), which includes ruins from *Castrum Tunsbergis*, Norway's largest castle in the 13th century.

Travelling

We recommend that you stay in Tønsberg during the seminar. Trains from both Oslo Airport Gardermoen and Torp Sandefjord Airport stop close to the town centre, hotels are within walking distance and buses to campus are easily accessible. The town also has a good selection of restaurants and cafes.

Airports & train connections

<u>Torp Sandefjord Airport</u> is the closest airport but has a limited number of direct routes from European destinations <u>Direkteruter | TORP Sandefjord lufthavn</u>. A shuttlebus, awaiting outside the airport terminal, brings passengers from the airport to the train station on most arrivals. <u>Train | To and from | TORP Sandefjord Lufthavn</u>.

Oslo Airport Gardermoen is located 150 km north of Oslo. It is the largest airport in eastern Norway offering a large number of domestic and international destinations. VY regional trains Vy | Train | Bus | Taxi | Book your trip at vy.no | vy.no from the airport to Tønsberg run once an hour Train, bus and taxi - Oslo Airport - Avinor. The travel from Oslo Airport to Tønsberg takes 1h 40min.

Buses to campus

Buses from Tønsberg to campus run on a regular basis. Fastest route takes appr 20 min. (bus 02).
