SHARE 2023-2027









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Background

SHARE- Centre for Resilience in Healthcare aims to become an internationally recognized research centre by reforming the quality and safety of current healthcare systems. An important part of becoming an internationally recognized research centre is to disseminate scientific knowledge and results using a broad spectrum of appropriate arenas. The SHARE dissemination plan 2023-2027 therefore provides both members and collaboration partners with a strategy for how and where scientific knowledge will be distributed.

Partners

SHARE currently engages more than 70 researchers across the partners and there are around 25-30 PhD students affiliated with the Centre.

Overall aim 2023-2027

The aim of SHARE's five-year dissemination plan is to make research results related to quality and safety in healthcare available both nationally and internationally. It is equally important to disseminate research results to patients, stakeholders, research communities and across the society as a whole. SHARE researchers should as such recognize the importance of becoming active contributors to the public debate in popular scientific channels and in peer review journals.

To reach the overall aim, the dissemination plan is divided in two main areas:

- Academic contributions
- Popular science contributions

Although a variety of stakeholders can be reached through both these arenas, academic contributions are designed to reach fellow researchers and research communities, while popular science activities are designed to reach patients, stakeholders and the society as a whole and as such, has a slightly different design and layout.

Large research projects

SHARE has several larger research projects, funded by the Research council of Norway or EU, which all has their own dissemination plans, as well as a number of smaller research projects without dissemination plans. The overall aim for SHARE therefore builds on the total number of dissemination activities for the larger research projects combined with the efforts from all the remaining researchers which all contributes to different smaller research projects.

Academic contributions

Papers and books

For the five-year period SHARE researchers will contribute to the writing and publication of approximately 2-4 textbooks and 200 peer-reviewed articles in international and national journals, distributed as follows:

SHARE researchers have an extensive network of international collaboration partners through the various research projects. Co-publishing across international borders is encouraged.

Seminars

SHARE research centre will organize annual research seminars for academic partners, empirical partners, and stakeholders, where consortium members, Scientific Advisory Board members, and leading international researchers will be invited to present state-of-the-art research on different topics.

The aim of all seminars should be to exchange knowledge between different stakeholders, and across macro, meso, and micro levels. SHARE research centre will strive to facilitate crossnational attendance on all seminars.

International conferences

International conferences are highly prioritized within SHARE research centre and viewed as one of the most important strategies to become an internationally recognized research centre. SHARE researchers will therefore aim to attend a large number of conferences. At national and international leading conferences such as Nordic Conference on Research in Quality and Safety in Health Care (NSQH) and The Resilient Health Care Society Meeting (RHCS). SHARE researchers will attend in high numbers to make a large scientific impact. All conference attendance should be associated with oral or poster presentation, and clearly show with the use of SHARE'S own logo that the research is affiliated with the Centre.

Popular science contributions

Reaching a broad audience of stakeholders is important both to receive feedback on our research, but also to distribute new knowledge within the general population. Popular science contributions include all kinds of activities which is designed and aimed at targeting patients, stakeholders and society as a whole. Examples of these include, but are not limited to; users, family, healthcare professionals, students, leaders, local/regional/national governmental bodies. The SHARE research centre aims to contribute with popular science activities spread at a high variety of different arenas such as stands, meetings, lectures, learning resources, blog posts, podcasts, Facebook and website-posts and seminars. The SHARE centre will strive to provide researchers within the centre with different learning opportunities related to popular science contributions and dedicate resources to provide researchers with appropriate administrative support during such contributions.

Social Media

Patient and stakeholder involvement
